Pastor's Ponderings – Opening with an Abundance of Care (and options)!
PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!

"Abba, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one."-Jesus (John 17:11)

Excitement is in the air; can you feel it?

Our leadership teams have been sending and receiving emails, writing policy, pondering potential hiccups, reworking ways of worship, and navigating persistent questioning as they have worked hard to safely reopen in-person worship at First Presbyterian. And that glorious day is finally upon us!

On Sunday, May 16, we will reopen worship for our leadership to do a "dry run" and make sure all the weeks of preparation have resulted in a viable plan. On Sunday, May 23, we will reopen worship for a limited capacity of in-person worshippers (50). This will be only one way of several ways to participate in worship. In addition to tuning in on CFU or watching recordings of the service, we are excited to add the option to worship live from a distance with Facebook Live. This can be accessed via the church Facebook page without a Facebook account.

Ready to worship in-person? Here is what you need to know:

Before worship starts:

Reservations with an online signup form will be required. Only those with reservations will be admitted.

Arrive about 10 minutes early (*no earlier*), via the 9th Street (northeast) entrance.

You will answer health screening questions & have your temperature taken before you check in.

Shepherds will guide you to a seat that is safely distanced from others.

During worship:

Proper mask wearing and distancing will be maintained; except in the case of children under 2 years old and those with breathing difficulties

Music will be played from a recording or the organ/piano. No congregational singing or unison responses will be employed at this time.

We will greet others without touching or violating distancing protocol.

Restrooms should be used only when necessary.

Children are invited to stay in the sanctuary. No childcare or nursery will be provided.

After worship:

Shepherds will dismiss worshippers by pew to directly exit the building. Visiting is welcome outdoors.

It is important to remember that this protocol is in place for the love and care of others. While many of us are vaccinated, some of us are not able to be vaccinated (including children). Let's keep care for them in mind. If you think you will not be able follow this protocol or are feeling unwell, please choose to worship in one of the other ways listed above. The more we continue to care for and protect one another, the sooner we will all be able to gather as one. *For the full, Session approved protocol for in-person worship, please see the attached document.*

Pentecost Offering

Pentecost Sunday is May 23. Each year we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the church.
