This Weekend's Worship – The Baptism of Jesus

Sermon: The Holy Spirit Descended
Scripture: Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

Worshipping from Home? We will be remembering our baptisms together this Sunday. You are invited to prepare your worship space with a dish of water for this meaningful practice.

Prayer for Baptism of Jesus Sunday

“Holy God, when Jesus was baptized in the Jordan the heavens opened, the Spirit descended, and your voice affirmed your love in Jesus for the healing of the human race and all creation. By water and word you lovingly invite us into this same life-giving mission. May your Spirit, moving like a stream of water flowing from its source, work in us this day to realize your vision of a world made new in Christ, in whose name we pray. Amen.”

Pastor's Ponderings – Water Words

This Sunday we will contemplate the significance of the baptism of Jesus by John in the Jordan River. It was a baptism of water and the Holy Spirit where a voice from heaven claimed Jesus as a beloved child. It is also a time when we remember that we, like Jesus, through baptism are named as God's own.

You may remember that when I led worship as your solo pastor for the first time, I shared with you my moving experience in a seminary class that secured “remembrance of baptism” at the top of my liturgical favorites list. I am bursting with joy to be leading us in this practice again on Sunday.

Last year we began a tradition of distributing “water words” as well. It is very similar to the tradition of “star words” or “star gifts” which some of you might know. You were given a waterdrop shaped piece of paper with a word written on it and invited to hang it up where you are sure to see it every day. It could be on your bathroom mirror, next to your computer screen, on your fridge, or even in your car. Last year they were sent in giving statements. This year you will be able to pick one up in person!



Of course, if you are not able to join us in person, we will send one to you through the mail. Email me, pastor@firstprescf.org, and I will be happy (even giddy) to send one along.

This year we will ponder what significance our words might have in our lives, and how God might be speaking through it. Often, looking up the word in the dictionary opens definitions we haven't thought of. Googling the word can show us where it is showing up most often in our context. And looking for occurrences in scripture can illuminate how believers have encountered the word through time.

I look forward to sharing insights with each other as we listen for God's guidance in 2022. Whatever God is calling us to through our water words this year, we know that the grace we have received in our baptism is sufficient for that call!


Thank You

Reading and Discussion for January 2022


The Cross and the Lynching Tree by James H. Cone
