Practicing What I Preach – What Do You Need?

This summer as we worked through the A Sanctified Art series, “I’ve Been Meaning to Ask”, we spent eight weeks considering how scripture teaches us to care for ourselves and one another. I hope you found the series to be as meaningful and formational as I did. At the time, I didn’t imagine that I would need to practice answering the question, “What do you need?” so soon.

My usual answer to the question would be something like, “nothing” or “I’m fine” or “dark chocolate.” But last week after realizing the need to address some needs at home, the answer was, “family leave”. The courage to tell colleagues and church leadership I needed some time away on short notice didn’t come easy, but I needn’t have worried. I received encouragement and support from every person I spoke to, and I am so very grateful.

Starting Wednesday, September 14th I will take two weeks of family leave. The Rev. Dr. Amy Wiles will be planning worship and preaching for September 18th and 25th and the Rev. Pat Geadelmann will cover pastoral care emergencies. I will return to the office on Wednesday, September 27th (in time for World Communion Sunday ☺).

While the nature of this leave is private, I can say that there is no need for concern or speculation. I am confident that this time away will be just what I need to care for my family and come back ready to be fully present for our ministry together. Our faith community is one of love and support and the impulse will be to *do* something for us. Truly what will be most helpful are your prayers for a meaningful and restorative time away.
