Report from Working for Justice: Breaking Bias

Members took a break from regular meetings over the summer, but as individuals, we read the book *Organizing Church: Grassroots Practices for Embodying Change in Your Congregation, Your Community, and Our World* by Tim Conder & Dan Rhodes.

Our first meeting of the fall was held on September 7 via Zoom. We enjoyed a thoughtful discussion of the book.

On September 21, we welcomed guest speaker, Rev. Le Anne Clausen de Montes, M.A., M.Div., CPS from Mason City, where she is Ministry Advocate for Accessibility, Equality, Inclusion and Welcome. We met on Zoom and enjoyed a fruitful discussion. Rev. Clausen de Montes met with us in person at the church on October 5. We continued our discussion on opportunities to work for justice in our community while also increasing congregational vitality.

Scheduled meetings are on the first and third Wednesdays of each month from 10-11 AM, in-person or by Zoom, as announced. Congregation members are always welcome to join us.
