## **New Horizons Band Concert**

The New Horizons Band, made up of members who are 55+, will give their spring concert on Monday, May 1, at 7:00 pm. ## **Community Choir Concert**

A mass community choir from the Cedar Valley will be featured at a concert of music written by composer Mark Hayes on Monday, May 8 at 7:00 pm. Hayes is an internationally known composer and conductor. Many of his works are sung by church choirs for Sunday worship services. Hayes will conduct the community choir; instrumental performers will enhance the songs. #### Updates from Working for Justice: Breaking Bias

Viewing of the 1619 Project six-part film series was offered to the congregation on scheduled Sundays beginning on February 26. We watched the last episode on April 23. Lunches were provided and a short discussion followed each viewing. We averaged over 20 participants per viewing session. Participants included members of the Working for Justice: Breaking Bias group as well as members from First Presbyterian, Cedar Falls, Cedar Heights Community Presbyterian Church, UCC, Cedar Falls, and the Mennonite congregation.

Working for Justice: Breaking Bias will be offering new opportunities for learning to the congregation this fall. White Ally training will be provided by members of the Mennonite congregation beginning in September. Civility training provided by Interfaith Alliance of Iowa will also be offered. Watch for more upcoming information about each of these exciting opportunities! Everyone is invited to upcoming meetings of Working for Justice: Breaking Bias on May 3 and 17 at 10 AM in the church dining room. On May 3, we will be discussing a paper from the Synod of Lakes and Prairies entitled: What is the Biblical and Theological Motivation for Restorative Action? (restorative action vs. reparations) If you'd like to join us, ask the church office or Sandy Jensen for a copy of the paper to read before the meeting. On May 17, we will be watching an interview with the woman who is working to start Iowa's first Black-owned bank; a discussion of the video will follow.

Working for Justice: Breaking Bias will be on summer break during June, July, and August. We will resume meeting on Wednesday, September 6 at 10 AM.
