A Note of Appreciation from the Pastor

"We can do hard things." I'm not sure when this phrase became a frequent refrain in my thinking. Likely it was during the worst of the pandemic when almost everything felt difficult and nothing felt safe or familiar. It's become a prayer of sorts, helping me retain perspective when the fullness of life blocks my ability to see beyond the current challenge. It reminds me of three things.

First, it names that the situation is *hard*. Many of us were taught to just pretend that whatever life throws at us is simple a case of mind over matter—sometimes to the point of ignoring our own experience and unintentionally alienating those who could help. When we name that we are going through a difficult time, we open ourselves to help. A quick skim through the Psalms shows that naming our pain is okay. God has heard it all before and is ready to hear it again.

Second, it declares that we are not alone. *We* can do hard things because no one must do everything on their own. God strengthens us through the Spirit and through our siblings in Christ. There is great strength in a faith community when we work together.

Third, it spurs us to action. I'll be the first to admit that overwhelm can shut me down. It can also cause groups to freeze and turn inward, not knowing what to do next. Communal overwhelm is a real thing that can hinder the vitality of the community. When we sense that overwhelm, we can turn toward God and ask for guidance to take one faithful step at a time.

All of this is to say, "First Presbyterian Church, you did hard and beautiful things last week." In a span of three days you worked together to support two families who lost loved ones, even while grieving their losses yourselves. You warmly welcomed our new camp director at a special worship service. You celebrated the legacy of organ music in our congregation with a concert full of inspiration. You coordinated receptions and washed dishes; you made phone calls and gave hugs. You rehearsed, recycled, and reminded. You showed the love of Christ in these beautiful ways and more.

I thank God for you all and for the opportunity to do the hard and beautiful work of our life together with such faithful people.
