WALKING IN THE STORM: Spiritual Practices for a Resilient Faith

In this eight-week worship series we'll explore basic Christian spiritual practices as ways to build up resiliency in times of crisis, chaos, uncertainty, and distress. Centering on the story of Peter walking on water, the series looks at body care, grief, forgiveness, anger, connection, grace, and gratitude. Be sure to join us as we build resilient faith together.

Worship on Sunday, July 2 "Sacred the Body" Communion Sunday

Scripture: Psalm 31: 6-13, 23-25, Romans 12:1-2

The psalm for this Sunday viscerally articulates how each part of us—our mental, physical, emotional, and spiritual selves—are interconnected. In times of crisis, it's easy to let our bodies go untended. Christianity has a long history of damning the body in favor of some untethered idea of "spirit." Yet the body is the vessel God created and chose for our being in the world, so it deserves our care. In the snippet from Romans, Paul mentions that we are to present our bodies as a "living sacrifice." In ancient religious practice, living sacrifices to God were the best animals a worshipper had to offer—the strongest, sleekest, most beautiful offerings. We are called not to sacrifice our bodies by destroying them, but to build them up, as our "spiritual worship." What spiritual practices might we engage as a reminder that care for our bodies is a necessary part of a resilient faith?

"Body care is spiritual care. And I want to be clear: I'm not talking about diets and exercise. I'm not talking about *changing* your body. I'm talking about caring for the body you have in such a way that you feel safe and whole inside of it." The Rev. Carol Holbrook Prickett

Prayer: God of all power and peace, as Jesus sent his disciples out to heal the sick, gather the lost, and proclaim the nearness of your kin-dom, make us ready to go and share the good news we have received: through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.


