Celebrating Epiphany – January 7 THOSE WHO DREAM...PERSERVERE

Scripture: Isaiah 60:1-6, Matthew 2:1-12

This image is a meditation on the gift boxes spiraling out from the center of the Star of Bethlehem. The top of the central square opens as Mary receives the gifts of the three Wise Men. Multiple paths surround the star, portraying the wise decision of the Magi to return home a different way to resist the fear-ridden power of King Herod.

"When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him." The power of fear is palpable; it is easy for a leader to share and to use to his advantage. In this story we are reminded of the wisdom that has been gifted to us by God through Jesus' ministry—the wisdom to avoid imbibing and stoking fear. Knowing this wisdom to be true, and knowing Herod to be a leader who leads fearfully and by fearmongering, I wonder how often we humans can fall into this pattern. We know the story well. The Magi's decision buys time

for Mary and Joseph to make a move that will eventually save the life of God incarnate. They choose to leave the country as refugees, to escape the oppression that Herod's fear imposes on their child.

Can we combat the fear within ourselves—to see beyond it to the love and hope that are also held in every moment? With each decision, we first choose our lens. Can we make it our intention to see the world through love, not through fear? —Hannah Garrity, sanctifiedart.org

Welcoming Corp: Helping a Refugee Family

Here is your chance to participate in our efforts to sponsor an immigrant refugee family in the Cedar Valley. A group of 7 individuals from Cedar Falls Mennonite Church and First Presbyterian Church are preparing to sponsor an immigrant refugee family. We are working through the <u>Welcome Corps</u>.

We need to raise at least **\$2,425** per person and we have a goal of a total of at least **\$12,125** to support a family of 4-5.

Sharing with our Neighbors

Occasionally, people stop by the church looking for assistance with food or personal care items. Our Community Food Box in the entryway is a resource that our church uses to help these neighbors in need. Some of these folks are transient or homeless and maybe don't have cooking appliances.

These folks often are looking for things a little more basic than what goes to the Food Bank. (Cereal requires milk, which they may not have.) Such items are:

- Chunky Soup, Progresso Soup, canned Ravioli, canned beef stew, peanut butter, Spam or other hearty items with protein and vegetables. Peel off lids are preferable but not required.
- Pudding cups, applesauce cups, fruit cups that are in INDIVIDU-AL cups with peel back tops.
- Macaroni & Cheese, mashed potatoes (microwave or stovetop)
- Laundry detergent, toilet paper, men's deodorant, men's bar soap, toothpaste, razors (sensitive skin), Tylenol (no NSAIDs)

Contributions of these items are always welcome. Excess donations go to the Northeast Iowa Food Bank.
