## what Does it wean to be a Disciple of Jesus

Scripture: Mark 8:31-38

## What Does It Mean to Be a Disciple of Jesus?

The word discipleship comes from the Greek word *mathetes*, meaning "follower". In Jesus' day, teachers called their disciples to live with them and learn from them. Jesus taught by using parables, encounters with outsiders and powerful people, and calls to imitate him, thus leaving their old lives behind. Discipleship in Jesus' name entails sacrifice.

In Mark eight, Jesus calls disciples to deny themselves and take up their cross, even to the point of losing their lives for his sake. He challenges us to set our minds on divine things rather than human things. It can seem like a tall order. After all, it's easy for Jesus to say, he's fully divine and fully human.

It is important to remember that we are called to radical discipleship as a community, not as a group of individuals each striving for independent holiness. When we sacrifice, we do so with the support of an entire community. In this way, we can follow Christ and spur change for a more just world.

<u>Minister Candace Simpson</u> shares this example, "The Montgomery Bus Boycotts worked primarily because people made decisions to surrender things together, and organized to live differently in the meanwhile. People with cars would carpool neighbors to their workplaces and charge the same amount as the municipal bus service. Community members would cook for people. Mass meetings were held to encourage shared sacrifice and remember the principles of the boycott." This communal approach led to lasting change and a better world for many.
