Scripture: Exodus 20:1-17; Matthew 22:34-40

What Is Sin and How Do We Turn from It?

Even in the earliest stories of the Bible we see a pattern of people making mistakes and living and acting in ways that God did not intend. As the rules of the road are meant to create a safe environment for all drivers, the Ten Commandments (Exodus 20:1-17) function to create a safe and God-centered community. In Matthew 22:34 40, Jesus is asked to name the most important of the hundreds of Jewish laws. Jesus' response quotes Old Testament passages Deuteronomy 6:4 and Leviticus 19:18.

Individuals and groups of people make mistakes. We live and act in ways that God did not intend; we sin. Even though we return to sin repeatedly as human beings, we believe in a God who returns, again and again, to offer us forgiveness and mercy. Through the grace and mercy of God, we can turn from sin and the power of evil in the world.

Refugee Settlement Project

Here is your chance to participate in our efforts to sponsor an immigrant refugee family in the Cedar Valley. A group of 7 individuals from Cedar Falls Mennonite Church and First Presbyterian Church are preparing to sponsor an immigrant refugee family. We are working through the <u>Welcome Corps</u> training materials and expect to submit an application to sponsor a family by the end of December.

One aspect of sponsoring a family is to provide financial support for the first 90 days that this family lives in our community. The Welcome Corps plan calls for us to raise at least **\$2,425** per person for this support and we have set a goal of raising a total of at least **\$12,125** to support a family of 4-5.

If you would like to help in this effort, please make a donation to First Presbyterian Church with the note "Newcomer Support" in the memo line. All donations will be kept in a separate account and used only for the purpose of supporting immigrant families. If our efforts do not reach hosting a family, all funds in this account will be donated to LIRS (Lutheran Immigrant and Refugee Service).

Other in-kind donations will be gladly accepted and those needs will be communicated as they arise.
