March 10 – Fourth Sunday of Lent

"What Does It Mean to Show Christ's Love?"

Scripture: John 21:15-19

What Does It Mean to Show Christ's Love?

Jesus taught his followers that to serve the least in the world was to serve him. This week we continue to make significant connections between affirming Jesus' love for us and our call to show Jesus' love to our neighbors, near and far.

In John 21:15-19, Jesus asks Peter, "Do you love me?" three times for emphasis, just as a schoolteacher may have a class repeat something several times to make sure they have learned it. Jesus also instructs Peter to "feed my sheep" three times, which highlights the importance of the task. We believe that the church is called to be a sign of the Kingdom of God in the world: a place where there is no poverty, no inequality, no exploitation, and no violence. In our acts of Christian love, we show God's intention for our world.

Confirmation can be a time for us to grasp that Jesus has work for us to do and begin to explore what those plans might include. As Presbyterians, we believe that we serve others in grateful response to the grace of God in Christ.

Book Discussion Opportunities


