April 14 – Third Sunday of Easter "Will You Devote Yourself to the Church's Teaching?"

Scriptures: 2 Timothy 1:1-14, Hebrews 12:1-2

Will You Devote Yourself to the Church's Teaching?

This week we continue our confirmation series, Big God Big Questions. This week's question is, "Will you devote yourself to the church's teaching?" As part of the church's ongoing commitment to "faith seeking understanding," we devote ourselves to the study of the Scriptures and the teachings of the church. In so doing, we come to understand more fully the nature of the faith we profess in Baptism and at Confirmation.

Knowing God includes knowing about God. When we love someone, we want to know about them, how they think, and what they like to do. We also benefit from knowing what other people know about the beloved. So it is with God. The word, "tradition" comes from a Latin verb that means "hand over." When Paul reminds the church at Corinth about the propriety of the Lord's table, he writes, "For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you" (1 Corinthians 11:23; italics added). Teaching and learning to content of the Christian faith is like learning about a new friend from an old friend.

Summary of the Congregational Retreat and Follow Up Session Meeting

Congregational Retreat 4-7-24

41 members of the session, deacons, and general congregation met from 12-4 pm Sunday afternoon, April 7, in the church dining room to discuss the current status and future of the church. Those present were a very good cross section of the church that provided very active, thoughtful, and insightful contributions to the discussions. Rev. Ian McMullen, Pastor to the Presbytery, facilitated the discussion.

Reverend McMullen summarized the conclusions and decisions we had made during the New Beginnings process in 2016 and the revisit we did in 2019 as part of the process that led to Pastor Julie joining us. We discussed in small groups how we worked to implement the decisions made, the impact COVID had on that implementation, and the adjustments and ongoing work post-COVID. Reverend McMullen then led us thru a review of our Vision and Mission Statements and emphasized the importance of clearly understanding and agreeing to central "why" of our ministry before we get into the "what" and "how" of what we do. What is the central "why" that we can refer back to that should guide and define what we do as a congregation and how we do it?

We then completed a group analysis of our ministry. The following were determined to be our top strengths and weaknesses.

- Strengths We are an open, affirming, and accepting congregation. We have a good music program. We respond well to specific needs with money, time, and talents.
- Weaknesses We have a congregation that is getting smaller and older. This negatively impacts our current and future financial resources but also impacts the overall energy to do the work of the congregation.

Follow Up Session Meeting 4-9-24

The session met on April 9 to review the outcomes of the meeting on Sunday and to define our direction from here. We agreed to designate our current Vision Statement as our "why":

In response to our relationship with Jesus Christ, we commit to grow in our personal faith, unite in love as a family of faith, and reach out in service to others.

Our plan is to evaluate and prioritize the current and future work of the church using the three commitments of the Vision Statement. We want to do this in a way that recognizes the realities of a smaller and older congregation while striving to increase the overall vitality of the congregation and maximizing our positive impact on the community around us. We decided that each Ministry Team will evaluate their current activities and decide what they might release and what could be refreshed. After this is complete, Session will identify ways that feedback from the congregation as a whole will be gathered.

A huge thank you to all of you that participated so actively and thoughtfully during our meeting Sunday afternoon. We look forward to working together in faith as we chart our future together.
